PLAY IS THE WAY – LIFE RAFT

The Play is The Way Life Raft involves five key concepts; 'Treat others as you would like to be treated', 'Be brave – participate to progress', 'Pursue your personal best no matter who you work with', 'Have reasons for the things you say and do', and 'It takes great strength to be sensible'. With a deep understanding of these five concepts, students have a means to build a safe school environment and embrace the ups and downs of life and learning. The truism, *the best way to learn something is to teach it* can be of considerable assistance when it comes to helping children deeply understand, embed and practise the Play Is The Way, Life Raft concepts. It is here that parents, caregivers, the extended family and friends can be of help. Inviting your child(ren) to teach you about each of the concepts starts a discussion in which you can generously plead ignorance and thereby require educating in the meaning, implications and challenges of the concepts. The attached flier shows the Golden Rule – Treat others as you would like to be treated, and outlines examples of How the Golden Rule looks in their class.
