Dunkeld Consolidated School holds various fundraisers throughout the year and we thank our parents and families for their organisation and support of these events.

Financial Support for Families

Dunkeld Consolidated School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- Camps, Sports and Excursions Funding (CSEF) available to eligible families.
- State Schools Relief Support available for uniforms/footwear.
- Second-hand uniforms.
- Local community support.

Camps, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF)

If you receive CSEF funding your child's Extra-Curricular Items and Activities will be paid using the CSEF funds received by the school. The CSEF amount for 2023 remains at \$125.00 per eligible student.

CSEF funding is available to those families who hold a Commonwealth Health Care Card at the beginning of Term 1 2023 (30 January 2023). CSEF application forms for 2023 will be sent home with students at the commencement of the 2023 school year.

If you have previously applied for CSEF and your circumstances have not changed, you will not need to apply again as your applications rollover from year to year.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
