It has been a busy and rewarding few weeks at Dunkeld Consolidated School, filled with learning, connection, and important steps toward 2026. Our future Prep students recently enjoyed their transition session, exploring early literacy and numeracy tasks, building friendships, and practising the routines that will help them begin next year with confidence. growing sense of belonging and excitement was wonderful to see.

Our Year 2/3/4 students also headed off to Warrnambool for a fantastic two-day camp led by Naomie Phillips and Jackie McShane. They explored local attractions, engaged in hands-on demonstrated impressive learning, and independence and teamwork. While the campers were away, our Year 1 students participated in a tailored learning program with Anne Gilbert, deepening their literacy and numeracy skills through rich and engaging activities.

The Food Fight Fundraiser was launched with great enthusiasm, giving students the opportunity to support the community while developing leadership, empathy, and teamwork and we are all looking forward to the Food Fight which will take place on Friday 12 December along with our final assembly, the opening of the Meeam Court and the announcement of the 2026 Student Leaders.

Students have been completing their DIBELS literacy assessments to help us better understand their phonemic awareness, fluency, and decoding skills. This data will guide targeted teaching and support differentiated learning as we plan for 2026. Staff have also been collaborating on key elements of the Victorian Teaching and Learning Model, including reporting processes and the development of classroom resources to ensure consistent, high-quality learning experiences for all students.

Operationally, staff have been engaging in early planning for the 2026 Annual Implementation Plan, with strong themes emerging in literacy growth, student wellbeing and engagement, and the consolidation of VTLM practice.

As we near the end of the school year, I want to extend my sincere thanks to every member of school community for your time, commitment, ongoing and support. Your thoughtful contributions, willingness to work collaboratively, and genuine care for our students, staff, and families profoundly shape the direction of our school. The trust you place in our staff and the respectful way you approach each decision make a meaningful difference. Thank you for your dedication to Dunkeld Consolidated School. It is a privilege to work alongside you.



SOUNDS-WRITE

We are now reading 'Somebody's Land: Welcome to Our Country' by Adam Goodes and Ellie Laing. It introduces the Preps to First Nations history.


DATES TO REMEMBER

LITERACY




