Readers' Cup Challenge

On Wednesday 26 October 2022, Dunkeld Consolidated School hosted this year's MARC Library Readers Cup. Students from the following schools (from Grades 3 to 6) participated in this event – Cavendish Primary School, Peshurst Primary School, Macarthur Primary School, Coleraine Primary School and Branxholme Wallacedale Community School.

Well-known Australian children's author, Mr Justin D'Ath, was the guest author and presenter. Mrs Bree Porter, MARC Librarian, co-ordinated and organised this exciting event, supported by Mr Ash McLachlan.

All teams read a total six pre-selected books for the Readers Cup Challenge. Each team completed a quiz on the books to show their knowledge of the text, and they then presented a creative response in a form of their choice on one or more of the books e.g. diorama, alternative ending, illustrated timeline or text extensions.

School team presentations were made to the judging panel, consisting of Mrs Bree Porter, Mr Ash McLachlan and Mr Justin D'Ath.

The Coleraine Primary School team was awarded the Readers Cup for 2022, and Dunkeld Consolidated School was awarded the People's Choice Award.



Kinder to Prep Transition Program

Wednesday 9 November was our first formal transition day at school for our 2023 Preps as part of our Kinder to Prep Transition Program. The excited Kinder students were paired with Prep 'Buddies' who enthusiastically looked after them during their visit. While some may have been a little apprehensive, they were soon all enjoying a 'Dr Knickerbocker' sing along with Mrs Gilbert.



In small groups they rotated through five activities, including: building with straws to create 3D shapes, a handwriting task (tracing the lines), sorting and counting animals, playing with Lego/Duplo, and cutting and pasting items to create a face. They sat with Buddies on the timber walkway and enjoyed their fruit snack, then eagerly headed out to play in the playground.



Tuesday 22 November was the second formal transition day at school for our 2023 Preps as part of our Kinder to Prep Transition Program.

They worked with Mrs Gilbert, the Prep students and some Year 6 helpers. The morning began with Mrs Gilbert reading a big book titled 'Meanies' and the children took great delight in seeing what silly things the characters got up to. The children rotated through five different activities including: making Meanies from playdough, using pattern blocks to finish off pictures, drawing and writing

about something that happened in the Meanies book, building with the small planks, and completing a pre-writing handwriting sheet. After eating fruit we went to the school hall to play games as it was too wet to play outside. Everyone worked beautifully and had a great time at school. They took home their 'schoolwork' to share with their parents.

"Teach Your Dinosaurs Science" Performance



On Tuesday 15 November Alistair Magee presented an exciting and diverse "Teach Your Dinosaurs Science" performance, for the whole school. It was lovely to be joined by the three and four-year-old Dunkeld Kindergarten students, as part of our Kinder to Prep Transition Program. Alistair was accompanied by Microceratus and Regaliceratops, (dinosaur puppets) who were extremely entertaining and received many laughs.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

Special Assembly on Friday 11 November 2022 - Class Captain Reports

Alex Sutherland, Prep/Year 1:

I am in Prep. This is my first, Class Captain's report.



In Maths, we have been learning about Subtraction, Sharing and Money. Did you know the 5c coin has an echidna on the back? Did you know that the 10c coin has a lyrebird on it?
 In Inquiry, the Preps have been learning about special places and the Year Ones have been learning about Water.
 In Writing, we have been learning how to write a letter to someone. We wrote to Sam. He is a character in the book called 'Window' by Jeannie Baker.
 In Art, we have been printing pictures with Styrofoam and fruit and vegetables. We had to draw a picture of something on the styrofoam and then we poked holes in the styrofoam with the end of a paintbrush.
 When Ambulance Victoria came to visit our school, they talked about hospitals, and we got to look inside the ambulance. Percy the Pink Panther was in the ambulance. Sailor pretended she fell off a bike and she broke her wrist. They put bandages on her arm.

The Kinder students visited our school on Wednesday so they can get used to being at school. The Preps were helping them.



Sybil Patterson, Year 2/3:

This term we have made antonym ants. Antonyms are words that are opposite, this is an example, if you had day then night would be the antonym.

We have also been learning about synonyms and created synonym rolls. A synonym is a word with the same meaning, for example, if you had the word yummy the synonyms would be delicious and tasty.

We have created poetry this term on different ideas, such as water,

spring, and Remembrance Day. This week we have been reading *Thelma the Unicorn* and using it to help us identify characters, settings, problems, and solutions. In Maths we have learnt about multiplication, division and now we are learning about money. Inquiry has been very interesting, we are learning about what makes up our world and how water works, with all this rain it has been very helpful to learn lots about water!



Will Griffin Wilson, Year 4/5:

This is my first, Class Captain report. I have enjoyed being our class captain because I like to take the notes to the office.

In Maths we have been learning about decimal fractions and how to write and compare them. Earlier we learnt about mass and used this skill in cooking when weighing ingredients.

In reading we have been reading *The Wild Robot*. It is about a robot who ends up on an island. She learns how to survive from animals.



In writing we worked on writing a narrative. My narrative is called *The Crazy Backrooms*. It is about a group of friends who fall into a backroom and need to work together to try and escape.

In Art we have created art pieces inspired by Spring. We used permanent markers, white oil pastels and water colour paints (art pieces were displayed to the audience).

We also created artwork inspired by Remembrance Day.

In Wellbeing with Mrs Field, the Year 4 students have been learning about empathy. Empathy is where you think of how others are feeling.

In Inquiry the Year 3 and 4 students have been learning about different environments on the earth and what animals live in them and how they adapt and survive. We finished our unit by researching an environment and including at least five facts on it. We could display our learning how we wanted to.

This week we welcomed Kai and his family back to our school.



Jack Jones, Year 5/6:

I was amazed I was chosen for Class Captain. I am enjoying my role and so far, my job has been easy.

We are halfway through Term 4 and we have been very busy.

In Literacy, Mrs Phillips read our class the novel, titled 'Once'. Then it was our job to do a book review. I think the class did well.

In Writing Year 6 students have been working on their end of Primary School autobiographies and Year 5 have been doing biographies.

In Maths we have been trying to work out decimal fractions, mass, volume and capacity. I found volume hard.

Inquiry has been interesting as we have been studying *Diverse and Connected Worlds*. We had to research an Asian country and I chose North Korea.



Fun Fact – North Korea are incredibly strict. They only have four TV channels, and they are State owned. Forget about Netflix.

We looked at Cultural Traditions around the World. My partner Victaur and I chose Halloween for our project. We looked at why pumpkins were used in Halloween.

People started leaving England and Ireland in the 1800 and moved to America. They took their tradition of Halloween with them but instead of carving turnips they changed to pumpkins for their lanterns.

We made pumpkins out of cardboard and placed our research behind them.

During Art we made an Ode to Queen Elizabeth – sketching her head and shoulders, coloured it in, cut it out and stuck it onto a patterned piece of paper. (Heidi presenting.)

We used pastels to make Starry Night Pumpkins.
